

- Fluocinolone acetonide (FAC) intravitreal implant is indicated for the treatment of chronic diabetic macula oedema insufficiently responsive to available therapies.
- Migration of the implant to the anterior chamber (AC) can occur through gaps in the posterior capsule especially in vitrectomised eyes.
- Early removal of AC dislocated FAC implant is essential to prevent corneal oedema and damage from raised intraocular pressure.
- This case report describes the use of a 23 gauge flute needle to retrieve a dislocated FAC implant, which is a safe and easy technique.

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
